Course Overview

Course Description

Latin I offers an immersive introduction to the classical Latin language, as well as Roman history and culture. You'll learn Latin by reading *Lingua Latina per se illustrata* by Hans Ørberg, which follows a fictional Roman family living around 200 AD. As you journey with them, you'll explore Roman roads and villas, witness daily family life, hear stories of legendary heroes and military campaigns, and discover how Romans measured time — their days, months, seasons, and years.

Learning Outcomes

By the end of this course, you will be able to:

- Recognize and recall a core set of Latin vocabulary words.
- Read and comprehend adapted Latin passages, demonstrating an understanding of grammar and sentence structure.
- Use context clues to interpret the meaning and grammatical function of words and phrases in Latin texts.
- Describe key aspects of Roman history, mythology, and daily life, and make connections between these cultural elements and the Latin language.

ACADEMIC DISHONESTY STATEMENT

Campus courses maintain a strict policy concerning academic dishonesty, which includes cheating, plagiarism, assisting on an examination or paper when expressly forbidden by the instructor, and any other practices that demonstrate a lack of academic integrity. Cheating occurs whenever a student uses deception to avoid fulfilling the specific requirements of an assignment or course and/or to

receive a higher grade than they might otherwise receive. Using artificial intelligence software (such as ChatGPT) to generate writing and pass it off as one's own is also considered cheating. Plagiarism occurs when a student appropriates passages or ideas from someone else's writing into their own without providing proper documentation and/or without using quotation marks to indicate when they are directly quoting a source. It is the student's responsibility to know and adhere to principles of academic honesty. A student found guilty of academic dishonesty will be subject to academic sanctions ranging from failure on the assignment to failure in the course to, in cases of repeated or flagrant violation, suspension, or dismissal from participation in Campus courses. DROP PERIOD AND WITHDRAWAL

The Drop period for Campus courses is five days after the student has enrolled and their designated term has begun. No refund will be available after this point.

Although many Campus classes are technically self-paced, students will be provided with a pacing guide (when relevant) to assist them in knowing how best to complete their courses on time. Failure to log in during the first week after their course commences will result in automatic removal from the course.

If a student is significantly behind pace two-thirds of the way through their term, they are encouraged to withdraw from the course with a W or equivalent appearing on their transcript. Beyond that point, they will no longer be eligible for a W on their transcript and thus are in danger of receiving a failing grade. Campus will report persistent failure to participate to the transcribing college or university. After the two-thirds point, a student will receive a letter grade for the course, including the possibility of a failing grade.

INCOMPLETE GRADE

A temporary neutral mark "I" is given at the discretion of an instructor when, for a legitimate reason, a student cannot complete course requirements in a given semester. Apart from catastrophic circumstances, a student is not eligible for an incomplete if they have not completed at least 60% of their coursework for the semester. Typical instances might be an extended illness or an inability to complete the coursework because of extenuating circumstances. A contract between the instructor and the student will accompany this grade to indicate the nature of the work to be completed. An Incomplete Grade (I) should not be used as an alternative to a grade of F. An Incomplete Grade must be made up before the seventh week of the next term whether or not the student is subsequently enrolled with Campus or the university. If the grade is not made up by the deadline, it will be changed to the appropriate grade earned in the course at that point.
